The Minutes of the previous meetings were read and approved.

The Treasurer reported the audit cash balance unchanged.

Bids for a new police car were received from George Read & Co, Inc, Flourtown, Klenke & Co, Southampton, but none from Huber Sales Co, Hatboro, who were asked to bid. The bid from Read & Co, Inc being the lowest, the order was accordingly place with them who promised a delivery in about ten days.

The position of Supt. being made vacant because Mr. Eves had been appointed Police Commissioner, the Board considered some official should be responsible, with authority to take any necessary action and Mr. C. H. Phelps was therefore appointed with a salary of ten dollars per month.

The Board considered an increase in salaries for the police, disinterested officials and citizens having advised that they were doing their work in an efficient manner,--the final decision being \$160.00 per month for Chief Ottinger, and \$130.00 for Officers Haddon and Drager. the same to date from January 1st.

The Asst Secretary presented the proposed Budget for 1940 which with two alterations was approved and a twenty day advertisement ordered.

He also reported upon his investigation of the Tax Collector's books and suggested a change in detail of the duplicate which was left open for further consideration. He further proposed a complete consolidated cash book which could be ~~made~~ kept for each year, duplicates of which could be made on typewriter and furnished the School Board and the County., with each check which they received which was approved and the use thereof to begin with 1940 duplicate.

Mr Weir introduced Mr. Cressman, representative from the U.P.A. who explained the terms and conditions connected with the proposed township building for offices and storage of machinery, trucks and tools.

Resolved---that the Building Code as read, to be known as "The Upper Dublin Building Code of 1940" is hereby enacted and in force March 22, 1940

Mrs Craven from Oreland, presented a complaint in reference to three fifty foot lots on Apel Ave. which were in a Zone requiring seventy five feet for building , requesting that an exception should be made. The Chairman called her attention to the Zoning Code wherein necessary instructions were given now to procure an exemption.

The Board considered what work the Building Inspector had thus far done and it was unanimously agreed with him that the fees , \$42.00, thus far received should be his recompense to date.

Mr. Weir presented a pencil tracing of the ground lay on Twining road which controled the delivery of water regarding which Messrs Hummel & Cressman who are building two houses on the road, near Orlando Ave, had asked that some action should be taken. As the removal of a large in the road would probaly cure the trouble it was agreed that if they would bring the level of road down to a point advised by Mr. Weir that the Board would macadamise the said section.

Peach Spray Letter No. 1

Purpose - To control peach leaf curl, San Jose scale and reduce early twig infections of brown rot.

Time - Apply spray while the peach buds are completely dormant. Fall spraying is recommended where leaf curl and San Jose scale were present in 1938, and spring spraying where brown rot is the main problem. Fall spraying with Bordeaux mixture may be started as soon as all green leaves are off, but lime sulphur spraying should be delayed until four weeks after the leaves are off to avoid bud injury.

Material - Bordeaux is slightly more effective than lime sulphur in controlling leaf curl and is more effective in preventing brown rot when used in the spring.

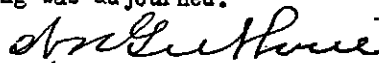

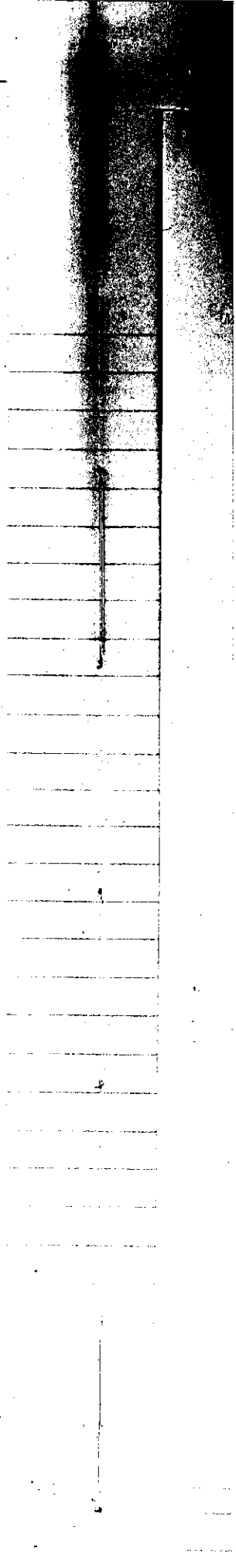

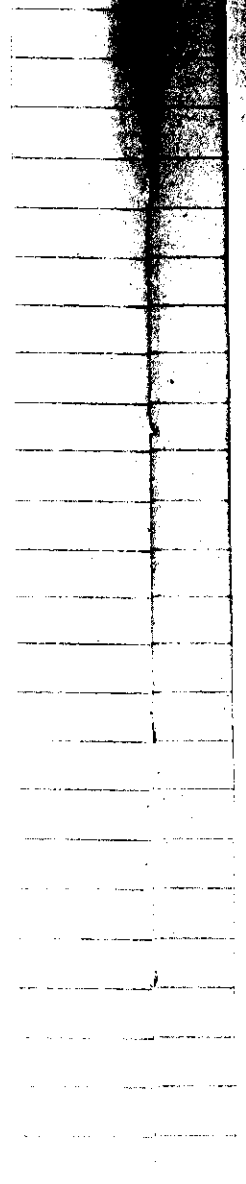

We were advised that there are about 200 houses on these streets and there is an urgent need for a sewer system to service the properties.

Ambler Borough sewer disposal system was designed to accommodate 1000 homes and the Borough's present plant could probably carry the additional load to service the 200 additional homes in Upper Dublin Township. Mr. Weir is confident that a satisfactory arrangement could be made with Ambler Borough to meter the additional sewerage through their plant.

Mr. Weir estimated that the system would cost approximately \$100,000.00.

It would be necessary to establish a sewer district in this area and the cost of construction would be assessed against the properties in this district. Roughly it appears that each property, including vacant lots would be required to pay something like \$300.00 and the owners would be subject to additional expenditures of connecting with the sewer. They would be required to pipe from the curb line and hook up with the sewer.

The Township has the authority to pass a resolution to establish a sewer zone but the proposed plan would be to advertise for three weeks and the taxpayers could protest and defeat the project if the taxpayers whose assessment totals 50% should file a protest.

It was believed that no federal aid could be obtained for such a project at this time and Mr. Weir expressed the opinion that we could probably obtain federal aid representing 60% of the cost after the war has ended.

We concluded that the property owners would not be willing to shoulder the financial burden of paying for the entire construction at this time and that they would look with greater favor on the project after the war when they could save 50% or 60% by reason of receiving federal aid.

It was also agreed that it would be very difficult at this time to obtain material and labor to complete the work.

A complete survey of the territory would be expensive at this time and the Board did not think it advisable to order the survey, since there was no immediate occasion to use it.

The Board concluded that the construction of the sewer was to be the number one project to be presented to the people at the first opportunity after the war.

There was a discussion of the recent action of the property owners in the block on Lower Church Street and South Main Street that was annexed by the Borough of Ambler and it was recalled that our Board had advised the people of that district
