On behalf of the police department's command staff, it is our pleasure to present the 2022 Annual Report. This report highlights some of the exceptional police services that we provided to our residents along with examples of the dedication and commitment to public safety by members of the Upper Dublin Police Department. The report also includes a variety of statistical data and an overview of programs and community engagement programs we provide to the public.

In 2022, we continued our long-term commitment on building public partnerships, transparency, and community trust. I am extremely proud of the dedicated men and women who selflessly work every day to ensure that Upper Dublin Township is a safe place to live and work.

Recruitment of new police officers continues to be a challenge nationwide and is significantly impacting local police departments' ability to hire qualified candidates. department focused an immense number of resources and time on staff recruitment this past year. The police hiring process is unique in that it includes a written exam, a physical agility test, and an in-person oral interview of the top 50 finalists. The timeline for advertising a vacant police officer position to filling the position could take more than one year. Once hired, the probationary officer(s) successfully complete Field must a year-long **Training** Program/Probationary Period. In the last two years, our department has hired five new officers (vacant positions), and three successfully completed their probationary period. Dublin Police Department is committed to only hiring the best and brightest individuals who can meet the highest standards of law enforcement.

Property crimes and thefts from vehicles in 2022 were up in the region. We want to remind our residents of several basic steps they can take to keep you and your loved ones safe:

- 1. Always be aware of your surroundings and trust your instincts. If you feel unsafe or see something suspicious, report it immediately by dialing 911. The police department encourages our residents to immediately report any suspicious persons or activities taking place in your neighborhoods. We would rather you be safe than sorry!
- 2. Keep your homes and apartments secure; always lock all your doors and windows when you are away.
- 3. Always lock your vehicles and do not leave valuables in plain sight.




"Bridging the Gap"




