#### **Letter to the Upper Dublin Community**

As we approach the end of another year, the Upper Dublin Police Department takes the time to reflect and evaluate our collective goals and objectives that we mapped out for 2023. With a few exceptions, many of our goals are directly related to ensuring public safety and providing our residents, schools, religious centers, and local businesses with the highest level of professional police services that our community has come to know and expect.

One of those few exceptions last year involved establishing a building committee of police personnel to research and compile information on the development of a new police station. There are many integral parts in designing a police complex that require hundreds of hours of planning to ensure our future building meets the critical needs of law enforcement activities in our community. Our police building committee worked closely with the township manager and D'Huy Engineering and GKO Architects to develop a cohesive operational floor plan with a focus on efficiency, functionality, and safety for our officers and the public. Our officers and civilian staff are excited with the overall design of the new township complex and police station and we are looking forward to the completion of this project which is scheduled for the end of 2025.

#### **Community Partnerships**

Our community partnerships with community leaders, school officials, local businesses, and residents continue to be our number one priority in fostering a safe and thriving community. In October 2023, we were proud to swear in our first official Police Chaplain, George Weldon, who recently completed his ministry at United Lutheran Seminary. Pastor Weldon has been employed with the police department as a Police Communication Officer for the last four (4) years and he is now taking on the additional role as our department Chaplain. In 2024, Pastor Weldon will expand the Chaplain program to include other religious leaders in our township.

Other community initiatives in 2023 include running two (2) new community outreach programs, our Citizen Police Academy for adult community members and Cop Camp program for youths ages 9 to 11. These educational programs are part of our commitment to community engagement that will continue to strengthen the bonds we have with our community.

#### **Promotions & Achievements**

In 2023, the police department held several promotional exams for the positions of Corporal, Sergeant, and Lieutenant positions. As a First-Class Township, promotional testing processes are approved and validated by the Upper Dublin Civil Service Commission. This

competitive testing process requires months of preparation and studying by our officers and supervisors who are interested in advancing their leadership roles within the police department. We appreciate the efforts of all who participated in the promotional exams, and we want to acknowledge the following officers who were recently promoted; Officer Christopher Reading was promoted to the rank of Corporal. Detective Kevin Shanahan was promoted to the rank of Sergeant and Sgt. Ryan Judge was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant.

#### **Police Accreditation Standards**

Also in 2023, the police department underwent a re-accreditation assessment. Accreditation is a voluntary program, administered by the Pennsylvania Chiefs of Police Association. The Upper Dublin Police Department was initially accredited in 2005 and was one of the original police departments in Montgomery County to achieve an accredited status. Since May 2005, the police department has been successfully re-accredited in 2008, 2011, 2014, 2017, 2020, and again in 2023. During the 2023 re-accreditation assessment, our department received an overall compliance finding of 100%, which is only the 2<sup>nd</sup> time in the almost 25-year history of the accreditation program that this has taken place. As a result of the re-accreditation, the police department also retained its "Premier Agency" status, which was originally bestowed in 2020. Corporal David Madrak oversees and manages the accreditation process and the men and women of the Upper Dublin Police Department are proud to retain the agency's accredited status.

#### **Looking Ahead to 2024**

As we step into the new year, we are excited about the opportunities to build on our successes and address new challenges. Our commitment to community-oriented policing remains our priority, and we will continue to work collaboratively to ensure that Upper Dublin Township remains a safe, inclusive, and vibrant place to work and live.

I encourage community members and business partners to reach out to the police department with any questions, concerns or suggestions you have about police services or regarding specific police interactions. Your input, ideas, and feedback are invaluable as we work together to create a safer and more resilient community.


Representatives from Mobile Crisis are now on-site at the police department one day a week The expanded partnership will assist with bridging the gap between the police and mental health consumers






